### **BREED REGISTRATION**

**An animal is eligible to enter and compete at the Michigan State Fair LLC in only one breed Classification regardless if the animal is registered in more than one breed association or registry.**

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SHOW – OPEN & YOUTH**

**\*\*\* Please check and follow General Agriculture & Livestock Rules \*\*\***

1. Exhibitor form, Animal Entry form and Current W-9 (or Canadian) must be filled out and returned. **Entries must include fees.**
2. **OWNER IS THE EXHIBITOR.**
3. The beef show will be for breeding cattle only and will be open to adult and youth exhibitors.
4. Youth Exhibitors that will be competing in the junior division of the show must show their own animal unless species chairpersons grant special permission. In the event that a substitute showperson is approved, the substitute showperson must be a registered junior exhibitor in this show. Bulls must be born on September 1, 2018 or after in order for youth to exhibit bulls. Proper identification of junior exhibitor may be required, at the discretion of the show committee.
5. **Each Exhibitor or Family Unit is limited to eight (8) head per breed in the Open Show. Each Youth Exhibitor is limited to four (4) head per breed in the Youth Show. Youth Show is open to Michigan youth.**
6. All entries must be made in accordance with general livestock terms and conditions. Please go to: [www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com](http://www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com) and enter online or mail to: MSFLLC, 46100 Grand River Ave., Novi, MI 48374 by August 1, 2019. There is a mandatory \$5.00 processing fee for all mail in entries. **LATE ENTRIES AFTER AUGUST 1, 2019. Online entries ONLY due by August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019, without penalty.**
7. If you choose to enter via mail, the entry must be post marked (no metered mail) by the above stated deadlines. Make check or money order payable to the **“Michigan State Fair LLC”** or complete valid credit card information and signature.
8. In addition, all other breeds are welcome to participate in the **All Other Registered Breeds (AOR)** division. For heifers and bulls that have a registration certificate but do not satisfy the criteria listed below, those cattle will show in the **AOR** division. Shorthorn Plus, Sim Solution and Main Tainer animals show in AOR division.
9. There will be classes in the open show for bulls born on or after January 1, 2017, classes in the junior show for bulls born on or after September 1, 2018, heifers born on or after September 1, 2017, and cow/calf pairs. In the cow/calf classes, the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and must have been born on or after September 1, 2018. Cow/calf pairs will count as one entry fee unless the calf will also be shown in a class as an individual. In this case, two entry fees must be submitted.
10. The name listed on the entry form as exhibitor must also be listed on the animal's registration certificate as “owner”.
11. Ownership Deadlines: Beef cattle exhibitor entries must be owned by the exhibitor by August 1 of current year.
12. All junior, exhibitor owned cattle must be registered solely in the name of the youth exhibitor.
13. An exhibitor may substitute an animal within the same class as entered at no charge. The exhibitor will be charged a fee of \$5.00 to substitute an animal into a different class.
14. An exhibitor may not receive more than one award in group classes. An exhibitor may show a maximum of two head per individual class. Only first place winners are eligible for Champion prizes; Second place animals may compete for Reserve Championships.
15. Pair of heifers is two (2) heifers, any age (no cows), owned by one exhibitor or family.
16. Pair of bulls is two (2) bulls, any age, owned by one exhibitor or family.
17. **The floor in the livestock area is polished concrete. Bark will be provided by Michigan State Fair. Hay, shavings and straw are available from a feed source. Michigan State Fair provides bark for pre-bedding stalls before arrival.**
18. Grooming Regulations: Use of false tail heads or adding of hair or hemp is prohibited. No coloring agents may be used anywhere on the animal. This includes colored show foams (black, red, etc.). Use of powders is prohibited. No forced administration or pumping of fluids to create gut fill will be allowed. **Violation of any of these rules will result in the disqualification of the entry and/or exhibitor, and the exhibitor and/or their representatives, including family members, fitters, managers, etc., may be banned from future shows.**
19. Each breed association will receive a 10' x 10' booth space for breed promotional material, at no charge, if space available. **Please contact Superintendent by August 5, 2019.**
20. **Original registration papers** must be presented at check-in time for all cattle that will be shown in a breed division. Registration applications will not be accepted. Registration papers may be electronically checked for accuracy.

21. Cattle that do not have tattoos, tattoos that do not match the registration papers, or are not legible will not be permitted to show. Cattle with no RFID Tag will be removed.
22. Fans and other cooling devices will not be allowed in the aisles unless suspended overhead (**no fans mounted on carts in the aisles**). A maximum of one (1) fan per three head of cattle, owned by the same family or group requesting to be stalled together, will be permitted.
23. All bulls more than one year of age must be secured with a nose ring or nose lead secured to the satisfaction of the superintendent/s, or the bull will not be allowed to stay on the grounds. All cattle must be secured by neck ties and halters.
24. No tie out gates will be provided, but cattle may be tied to trailers in designated areas. Tie out will start at 7:00 pm. All cattle will be in stall by 9:00 am.
25. No grooming chutes allowed in aisles. Chute areas must be kept clean.

**26. DOG NOTICE (Exhibitors Only):**

- **NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS/BUILDINGS/TENTS, EXCEPT LEADER DOGS. Dogs are allowed in the camping area ONLY and must be kept on a leash at all times.**

27. Premier Michigan Breeder – The breeder winning the most points, not to exceed six animals in the open single classes exhibited by himself and/or other exhibitors shall be designated the Premier Breeder. The point system for determining Premier Breeder is as follows:

31. After entries close, if any AOR Breed has 10 or more head, that breed will be given its own Show.
